



1 Borrow books **Circulation Counter**

Bring materials and your card to the Circulation Counter. Returning books, renewal of loan period and loans for laptops are available here.
*Self-checkout machine available



2 Ask a librarian **Help Desk**

If you have a question, ask a librarian at the Help Desk. Interlibrary Loan (ILL) can be requested here.
*Opening hours: 9 AM – 5 PM on weekdays
Lunch break: 12 – 1PM (holiday season)



3 Search books **Retrieval Terminals**

You can search for books by titles or topics. Check the location and [Call No.](#) to find the book on the shelves.

4 Use PCs **Computer Workstation**

PCs and Wi-Fi are available with an account (Ikkyo ID). Word, Excel, PowerPoint and databases are available here.
*Some databases available only on campus.



5 Read books **Yomocca**

Yomocca is an exhibition corner for encounters with books. It features new or recommended books. Sanju Memorial Collection consists of donated books from alumni.




6 Print out **Printer**

A Co-op Copy Card is necessary for printing out. Please buy a card at the Co-op shop or vending machine in the library. Black & White print costs 10 yen. Color print costs 50 yen.

What are "Call No."?

Call No. are the numbers labeled on the spine. Books are shelved by Call No.—the so-called "address of the book." If you are unsure of a location, please ask at the circulation counter.

8 Study in a group

3 or more students can use Group Study Rooms. 3 rooms are in Main Building 2F and 2 rooms are in Periodical Annex 5F. Rooms can be reserved a week in advance.

7 Study by yourself

Reading Room, built in 1930, offers a tranquil atmosphere for study. There are 330 seats, beautiful stained glass and statues of contributors to the university.

Library seminars and events are often held here. For events information, please check the Library's website.



Automated Bookshelves

CHECK!

Automated Bookshelves are located in Main Building BF, 3F; Periodicals Annex BF, 1F, 3F-5F. Push button to turn on and open stacks. Please use by mutual concessions. In case sandwiched between 2 stacks, kick the red bar at the bottom of the stack. The stacks will make an emergency stop.


Read a graduation thesis
